DECREE

Diocesan Norm for Weddings in High School Chapels of the Diocese of Phoenix

The question has been asked, as to the lawfulness of celebrating Marriage Rites in the Chapels of Catholic high schools in the Diocese of Phoenix. Since Chapels on high school campuses are not designated as "approved places" for hosting such ceremonies, the Bishop of Phoenix, Most Reverend Thomas J. Olmsted, in order to provide clarity to the current and future practice, hereby promulgates this Norm for the Diocese of Phoenix. For all intents and purposes, this Norm is to be considered particular law for the Diocese of Phoenix, and must be upheld by all Catholic high school Administrators and Clerics in the Diocese of Phoenix.

This Diocesan Norm reads: "Since Catholic theology and ecclesiastical laws view the Parish church as the ordinary and proper place for the celebration of the Sacraments, including marriages involving at least one Catholic, it is only by special permission and dispensation that a marriage ceremony is permitted to take place at an alternative location. Furthermore, it is left to the discretion of the diocesan bishop to determine which locations are appropriate for the lawful and valid celebration of the Rite of Marriage involving at least one Catholic person. Therefore, with this Decree, notwithstanding customs contra leges which enjoy the force of law, I hereby declare that Chapels located on the campuses of all Diocesan High Schools in the territory of the Diocese of Phoenix, do not qualify as "approved places" for marriages. Catholics are encouraged to celebrate the Rite of Marriage in the local parish to which they belong, or in some other parish church or approved location to which they have an affinity.
